Learning objectives

By the end of the course, the trainee is able to:

- Protect a casualty and bystanders without putting yourself in danger
- Examine the casualty and pass a usable alert
- Perform the first aid actions suited to the condition found
- Use an automated external defibrillator

Content

- Protect, assess, alert, rescue: the full chain
- Bleeding, airway obstruction, unconsciousness, cardiac arrest
- Using the automated external defibrillator
- Back, head and neck injuries: what to do and what never to do
- Scenarios filmed and debriefed on your own site

Teaching methods and resources

Face-to-face training, on your site, in French or in English. Short theory inputs and scenarios on your facilities.

Documents issued

SST certificate under the INRS framework, valid for 24 months

Assessment

Individual certification tests from the INRS framework, conducted at the end of the session by the certified SST trainer.

Trainer

A trainer from professional emergency services: nurse, firefighter or military. Their identity, qualifications and professional liability certificate are sent to you before the session.

Lead time

Quote within 48 working hours. The date is then set with you, according to our availability and your production constraints.
